Marjorie Miner Political Biography



Marjorie (White) Miner became politically active in 1936 at 9 years of age when she supported the candidacy of Republican, Alfred Landon for President opposing Democrat incumbent Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Marjorie graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Secondary Education having a composite major in Political Science, History, and Sociology; Minor in English and Physical Education. While in college she was a member of the International Relations Club and a strong advocate for Military Installations in Alaska.

At age 21, she registered to vote as a Republican and has voted Republican in every election. She has been a Block Worker, Election Judge, Chairman of the Shoshone County Republican Central Committee, Chairman of Idaho Legislative District IV, Chairman of Idaho Region I, Vice-Chair of the Idaho Republican Central Committee, and Chairman of the Idaho Republican State Central Committee. During that time she was the only female in the continental US to be a State Chairman and also serve on the National Executive Committee.

Marj was President of the Shoshone County Republican Women's Club and in 1971, was a delegate to the 16th Biennial NFRW convention in Washington DC. She participated in a goodwill trip behind the Iron Curtain which included trips to West and East Berlin, Poland, St. Petersburg, Moscow, Hungary and Romania. The group also visited Vienna, Austria and Paris. Marj also ran for a Senate seat in the Idaho State Legislature but lost her election.

Marj was a Delegate to the 1972 Republican National convention in Miami, serving on the platform and rules committees. She was also a Reagan Delegate to the 1976 Republican National convention in Kansas City and a member of the National Rule #29 Committee. Marj was a participant at the Institute of Politics Conference of State Party Chairmen at the JFK School of Government at Harvard University.

During the Reagan Administration, she lived in Washington D. C. and worked in the office of Idaho Senator, Steve Symms.

After moving to Arizona, Marj served as President of the Tempe Republican Women's club, worked at election polls for numerous elections and has been a Precinct Committeeman for approximately twenty-four years. She is currently a Precinct Committeeman in Legislative District 18 and a proud member of Ahwatukee Republican Women.
