Meeting called to order 7:00 PM - President, Debbie Smith

Invocation - Chaplain, Lisa Pomraning

Pledge of Allegiance - Americanism Chair, Priscilla Poese

Americanism - Priscilla told us of the importance of National Freedom Day on Feb. 1, when President Lincoln signed the 13th Amendment, abolishing slavery.

Introductions - Debbie recognized elected officials, candidates and guests in attendance.

Approval of Minutes - Recording Secretary, Terry Giebelhaus asked for approval of minutes from November 2013. Minutes were approved with no corrections.

Treasurer's Report - Treasurer, Cindy Casaus, gave her report, upon which there were no corrections or questions.

President's Report - There will be 12 people representing ARW at the AzFRW Winter Meeting in Lake Havasu City. Debbie noted the thank you from the Child Crisis Center can be seen in the January newsletter. She announced the February meeting will be "Chocolates and Politics", and on March 25th we will have a Governor's Forum Breakfast.

Programs - 1st VP, Suzanne Sharer reported that we will be hearing from Representative Justin Pierce and Senator Michele Reagan as candidates for Secretary of State, and Hugh Hallman as candidate for State Treasurer. In February, Martin Sepulveda, Jeff Dial and Tom Morrissey will be speaking.

Membership - Mary Baumbach, 2nd VP, reported there were over 52 members for the 1st quarter. There is a new membership special. Bringing in a new member will put you in a drawing for a \$50 gift card. First drawing in June.

Ways and Means - 3rd VP, Marilyn Astroth gave thanks to those purchasing raffle tickets. Tonight's prize includes flowers, candy and 2 tickets to the Waste Management Golf Tournament.

Program - Suzanne Sharer introduced Representative Justin Pierce, who gave his background in Arizona, and qualifications for the position of Secretary of State. Senator Michele Reagan was then introduced. She told of her experiences in small business in Arizona and her qualifications for Secretary of State. They both accepted questions. Suzanne introduced Hugh Hallman, former Mayor of Tempe, who is running for State Treasurer. He spoke of how his past experiences have prepared him for the job of treasurer. Questions were accepted.

State of the Union Messages Worth Remembering

After what passed for a State of the Union address recently, as delivered by our current Chief Executive, we might do well to be reminded of the State of the Union messages of America's first President, which were considerably more useful for improving the state of our nation, and demonstrated his understanding of and commitment to the intent of the Founders.

Although the Constitution doesn't stipulate a specific time when the President shall "give to Congress Information on the State of the Union", George Washington established the precedent of an annual message presented to the Congress.



George Washington Delivers the First Address

As the first leader of this grand experiment in liberty, Washington faced numerous challenges during the 2 terms of his presidency, 1789 – 1797. In the 8 State of the Union messages he delivered between 1790 and 1796, he focused on areas he knew would be essential to the task of building, strengthening and unifying the new nation, and securing the rights of the people, aiming for a government "founded on the genuine principles of rational liberty, and with mild and wholesome laws". With prescient wisdom and sensibility, he called for a strong national defense; fiscal responsibility and reducing national debt; uniformity in currency, weights and measures; improved education to advance knowledge among the citizens; an efficient postal system; and measures that would encourage the advancements in agriculture, commerce and manufacturing necessary for supplying the needs of a growing country.

Concluding his 1st State of the Union address, Washington said to the assembled Congress, "The welfare of our country is the great object to which our cares and efforts ought to be directed, and I shall derive great satisfaction from a cooperation with you in the pleasing though arduous task of insuring to our fellow citizens the blessings which they have a right to expect from a free, efficient and equal government." He also expressed his hopes, in his 2nd address, that the actions of Congress would be "marked with wisdom and animated by the love of your country." Regarding the national debt, a topic he often raised in the annual addresses, he said, in 1793, "No pecuniary consideration is more urgent than the regular redemption and discharge of the public debt." The next year he warned of the "progressive accumulation of debt which must ultimately endanger all governments." As to the importance of a knowledgeable citizenry in the preservation of their rights and protection of the Constitution, Washington said, in his 1st address, "To the security of a free constitution it [knowledge] contributes in various ways...by teaching the people themselves to know and to value their own rights; to discern and provide against invasions of them." He advised, in 1794, "...let them persevere in their affectionate vigilance over that precious depository of American happiness, the Constitution of the United States."

Washington's final State of the Union address, in December of 1796, ended with a message of confidence, praise and hope: "The situation in which I now stand for the last time...recalls the period when the administration of the present form of government commenced, and I cannot omit the occasion to congratulate you and my country on the success of the experiment, nor to repeat my fervent supplications to the Supreme Ruler of the Universe and Sovereign Arbiter of Nations that His providential care may still be extended to the United States, that the virtue and happiness of the people may be preserved, and that the Government which they have instituted for the protection of their liberties may be perpetual."

In 2014, may that be our prayer too.


