



# "Bucks for Books": Final Update

ARW's successful "Bucks for Books" literacy project was brought to completion in early December, when the 24 books that were purchased with the contributions made by our generous club members at our September fundraiser were donated to beneficiaries in the east valley area.

Education and Literacy co-chair, Carol Wyatt, and Americanism chair, Priscilla Poese, delivered the books to the several recipients that had been chosen. All the donated books are on the NFRW Mamie Eisenhower Library Project's Recommended Reading List.



In our Ahwatukee community, books were given to the Ironwood Library and Kyrene Altadena Middle School. Three east valley schools also received books – two charter schools in Mesa and one in Tempe, all of which had participated in the Constitution in the Classroom program. Both of the Mesa schools, Burke Basic and Noah Webster, emphasize patriotism and knowledge of America's important founding documents, principles of liberty, and our country's history. The principals at the Mesa schools expressed their appreciation for the book donations from our club.

NFRW bookplates were placed in each book, identifying ARW as the donor organization.

Thanks again to our members for helping to promote education, literacy, and the love of reading.

# Two Republican Presidents, One Self-evident Truth



"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal..." When the Declaration of Independence was being debated in 1776, many of the Founders in the Continental Congress, including Thomas Jefferson, believed that the word "all" should, in truth and in practice, apply to all persons. The Creator Who created them all also endowed them all with "certain unalienable Rights" that included the right to life and liberty.

Fourscore and seven years later, our country's 1<sup>st</sup> Republican President, Abraham Lincoln, looked back to the Founders' intent in his 1863 Gettysburg Address, when he said, "...our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal." On Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> of that same fateful year, as the Civil War continued, Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation went into effect. In *A Patriot's History of the United States*, authors Larry Schweikart and Michael Allen explained, "...it is critical that an understanding of emancipation begin with Lincoln's perception that it first and foremost was **a moral and legal issue**, not a military or political one." [emphasis added] The proclamation declared that "on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred sixty-three, all persons held as slaves within any State, or designated part of a State,...shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free".

The process of achieving the goals of Lincoln and the Founders was a long, slow, difficult, and often painful one, but by the 1950s and 60s the issues of desegregation, equality, and Black civil rights were gaining considerable attention. During that period, a young Black Baptist minister in the South, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., became a prominent leader in the struggle, organizing boycotts, rallies and marches, but always stressing nonviolent means to achieve the desired ends.

On Nov. 2, 1983, another of our country's great Republican Presidents, Ronald Reagan, signed the legislation that created a federal holiday on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday in January each year, honoring Dr. King and his contributions, and in observance of his birthday. At the signing ceremony, President Reagan offered these remarks: "In America in the fifties and sixties, one of the important crises we faced was racial discrimination. The man whose words and deeds in that crisis stirred our nation to the very depths of its soul was Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. ...Dr. King made equality of rights his life's work...but he never stopped teaching nonviolence. ...In 1964, Dr. King became the youngest man in history to win the Nobel Peace Prize. ...In 1968...his life [was] cut short at the age of 39. But those 39 short years had changed America forever. ...So each year on Martin Luther King Day, let us not only recall Dr. King, but rededicate ourselves to the Commandments he believed in and sought to live every day: Thou shall love thy God with all thy heart, and thou shall love thy neighbor as thyself."

This year the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday is on Jan. 19<sup>th</sup>. Let us not only remember Dr. King (who was a Republican), but also that it is the Republican Party that was organized around the abolition of slavery, and has, since that time, been the political party that has championed the causes of freedom and civil rights for *all* Americans.
