# Americanism It's Still a Time for Choosing

With the wide range of experience, political philosophies and opinions on critical issues among all the candidates from both parties for the 2016 presidential election, voters certainly cannot complain that the current field offers them no choices. An important consideration for many of us, though, is whose policies will bring our country closer to the vision and intent of America's Founders.

It was October, 1964, shortly before that year's presidential election, when Ronald Reagan delivered one of his most famous speeches, "A Time for Choosing". While the televised speech was in support of Barry Goldwater's candidacy, Reagan took the opportunity to point out the real effects on America of 30 years of liberal, Democrat, big-government, big-spending programs, which would increase under Lyndon Johnson's "Great Society", as our national security and the freedoms of American citizens diminished. With our country approaching another time for choosing, perhaps a review of just a few of Reagan's observations and insights from that memorable speech might be beneficial:

"For almost two centuries we have proved man's capacity for self-government, but today we are told we must choose between a left and a right or...a kind of safe middle ground. I suggest to you there is no left or right, only and up or down. Up to the maximum of individual freedom consistent with law and order, or down to the ant heap of totalitarianism; and regardless of their humanitarian purpose those who would sacrifice freedom for security have...chosen this downward path. Plutarch warned, 'The real destroyer of the liberties of the people is he who spreads among them bounties, donations, and benefits.'

"They have voices that say, '...The profit motive has become outmoded. It must be replaced by incentives of the welfare state.' Or, 'Our traditional system of individual freedom is incapable of solving [today's] complex problems.' ...Another...defines liberalism as 'meeting the material needs of the masses through the full power of centralized government.' I for one find it disturbing when a representative refers to the free men and women of this country as 'the masses'...But beyond that, 'the full power of centralized government' was the very thing the Founding Fathers sought to minimize. They knew...a government can't control the economy without controlling people...They also knew, those Founding Fathers, that outside of its legitimate functions, government does nothing as well or as economically as the private sector...Government has laid its hands on health, housing, farming, industry, commerce, education, and, to an ever-increasing degree, interferes with the people's right to know. Government tends to grow...Because no government ever voluntarily reduces itself in size, government programs once launched never go out of existence. A government agency is the nearest thing to eternal life we'll ever see on this earth...Yet anytime you and I question the schemes of the do-gooders, we're denounced as being against their humanitarian goals.

"...So we have come to a time for choosing. Either we accept the responsibility for our own destiny, or we abandon the American Revolution and confess that an intellectual elite in a far-distant capitol can plan our lives for us better than we can plan them ourselves."

More than 5 decades later, we are still faced with the same choice. What will Americans choose in 2016?
