



Recalling the 11th Hour of the 11th Day of the 11th Month

At 5:10 a.m. on Nov. 11, 1918, representatives of the German government signed the WWI armistice agreement which, at 11 a.m. that day, would effect a ceasefire between Germany and the victorious Allied Forces, finally halting "the war to end all wars".



The war had not gone as the Germans had expected, and neither did the armistice negotiations which they had requested when defeat seemed likely. Among the many stringent demands and concessions to which they had to agree was the requirement that the armistice must be secured through the Allied Supreme Commander, Marshal Ferdinand Foch of France. After what France had suffered during the war, Foch had the satisfaction of presenting the armistice terms to six officials of the German government on Nov. 8, 1918. Three days later the armistice agreement was signed in the Compiegne forest of northeastern France, in what had formerly been the elegant dining car #2419 on the Orient Express. The railway car had been requisitioned and converted to serve as Foch's office during the war. Following the war, it was known in France as "Le Wagon de l'Armistice". Unfortunately, the car was taken over by the German army in WWII, and it was a bitter reminder to the French when it was their turn to make the concessions in 1940. They had to sign the Franco-German armistice in that same railway car, again in Compiegne.

To commemorate the events of Nov. 11, 1918, which led to the June, 1919, signing of the Treaty of Versailles that officially ended WWI, Woodrow Wilson issued a Presidential Proclamation which established the Nov.11 Armistice Day observance. It was to be a day for Americans to "be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory". In 1938, Armistice Day was made a nationwide legal holiday honoring WWI veterans, and in 1954, during the Eisenhower presidency, the Nov. 11 holiday became Veterans Day, a day to remember and pay special tribute to American veterans of all wars.

Our nation, in 1988, again had a President who took seriously his responsibilities as Commander in Chief, and who had great respect for our Armed Forces and veterans. The following remarks are from a speech Ronald Reagan delivered at a Veterans Day ceremony on Nov. 11 that year:

"Those who know freedom remember today those who gave up life for freedom. Today...we conduct ceremonies. We lay wreaths. We speak words of tribute. And in our memories, in our hearts, we hold them close to us still. ... We could not forget them. Even if they were not our own, we could not forget them. For all time, they are what we can only aspire to be: giving, unselfish, the epitome of human love. ... We think of them now, with love, with devotion, and with faith: the certainty that what they died for was worthy of their sacrifice – faith, too, in God and in the nation that has pledged itself to His work and to the dream of human freedom, and a nation, too, that today and always pledges itself to their eternal memory."

Thank you to all our veterans, to those currently serving and protecting our country, and to their families.

Programs - Suzanne Sharer, 1st VP, introduced our guest speaker, Mike Broomhead.


