Clarion Hotel-February 25, 2014

Meeting called to order 7:00 PM - President, Debbie Smith.

Invocation - Chaplain, Lisa Pomraning.

Pledge of Allegiance - Americanism Chair, Priscilla Poese.

Americanism - In honor of Presidents' Day and Valentine's Day, Priscilla presented us with a romantic quote from President Ronald Reagan.

Introductions - President, Debbie Smith recognized the elected officials, officers and guests in attendance.

Approval of Minutes - Recording Secretary, Terry Giebelhaus asked for approval of the minutes from January 28, 2014. Minutes were approved with no corrections.

Treasury Report - Treasurer, Cindy Casaus gave her report, upon which there were no corrections or questions.

Budget Report - Cindy also asked for any questions regarding the 2014 budget and moved, on behalf of the committee, to accept the budget. It was voted upon and approved.

Programs - President Debbie and Suzanne Sharer spoke of upcoming programs including Doug Ducey, candidate for governor in March, and a possible BBQ&A with details coming up soon. Suzanne gave an overview of the speakers for this evening.

Program - Suzanne Sharer introduced Tom Morrissey, candidate for state senate, who spoke to us on his vow to be a "citizen legislator", and presented his qualifications for that office. He also took questions from the members.
- Jeff Dial was planned as a speaker, but came upon a last minute conflict.

Martin Sepulveda, a candidate for state treasurer, spoke to us of his reasons for running for that office. He then told us that due to a new assignment as commander in the naval reserves, he feels it is honorable for him to withdraw from the race.

President Debbie Smith recognized member Kris Morrissey who was awarded the highest volunteer award by the AzFRW for her 3,690 hours of volunteer service.

Marjorie Miner reported on the scholarship. Applications must be returned by April 1.

Jill Norgaard, candidate for State House of Representatives, District 18, spoke on the importance of job creation. Darryl Jacobsen-Barnes spoke of her qualifications for Justice of the Peace-Kyrene Justice District.

Mike Bertocchi announced a volunteer opportunity on March 15 at Chrisman School, fingerprinting children. The 50/50 drawing of \$73 was won by member Priscilla Poese.

For the Land of the Free

It was on March 3, 1931, that *The Star-Spangled Banner* was officially declared America's national anthem. The last line of each of the 4 stanzas in Francis Scott Key's 1814 poem reminds us that our great nation was uniquely established to be "the land of the free". That was the intent of the Founders, as evidenced by the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution.



Freedom was the theme of the commencement address that Senator Ted Cruz delivered last May at Hillsdale College. The following are excerpts from that speech:

"I'd like to spend a few minutes discussing with you the miracle of freedom. In the history of mankind, freedom has been the exception...Human beings were told...that their rights emanate from a monarch and may be taken away at a monarch's whim...A revolution against this way of thinking...was embodied in the Magna Carta...That revolution reached full flower in Philadelphia in 1787, in a Constitution that began from two radical premises.

"The first is that our rights come not from kings or queens – or even presidents – but from God. As the Declaration of Independence put it, 'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights...'

"Second, in the Constitution, America's Founders inverted the understanding of sovereignty. Power comes not from the top down, but up, from 'We the People', and governing authority for those in political office is limited...As James Madison explained in *Federalist 51*: 'If men were angels no government would be necessary...the great difficulty lies in this: you must first enable the government to control the governed; and in the next place oblige it to control itself.' Even from my short time in elected office, I can assure you there are no angels in Washington, D.C. And that is why Thomas Jefferson said the 'chains of the Constitution' should bind the mischief of government. Only when government is limited are rights protected, the rule of law honored, and freedom allowed to flourish.

"...Freedom works...freedom produces opportunity...The political left in our country seeks to reach down the hand of government and move people up the economic ladder...And yet it never, ever works...Economic freedom and the prosperity it generates reduce poverty like nothing else...Men and women flourish...when afforded the equal opportunity to work and create and accomplish...It is precisely because economic freedom and opportunity outperform centralized planning and regulation that so many millions have risked everything for a chance at the American dream."

Senator Cruz's father had escaped to the U.S. in the late 1950's after imprisonment and torture in communist Cuba, and then, without dependence on the government, was able to build the "American dream" for himself and his children. Near the end of the senator's speech, he recalled his father's words to him when he was growing up: "When I was a kid, my father used to say to me: 'When we faced oppression in Cuba, I had a place to flee to. If we lose our freedom here, where do we go?"

We the People need to be, as originally intended, the guardians of our precious freedoms against the increasing encroachments by a Chief Executive with a pen and a phone, a radically activist judiciary, and an ever-more powerful regulatory bureaucracy, for, "If we lose our freedoms here, where do we go?"


