# "Hurrah for the Flag of the Free"

June 14 has been designated as Flag Day, a day honoring this proud national emblem of our country. The American flag has been known as Old Glory, the Star Spangled Banner, and a Grand Old Flag. It is also often called the Stars and Stripes, a descriptive name which inspired one of our country's most popular patriotic marches, *The Stars and Stripes Forever*, written by "The March King", John Philip Sousa.

Sousa was born in 1854, in Washington, D.C. His interest in music, particularly military music, and appreciation for the Marines came naturally – his father was a trombonist in the U.S. Marine Band. As a child, he studied voice, as well as several instruments, and later received training in music theory and composition. While still in his early teens, Sousa's father enlisted him as an apprentice in the Marine Band. In 1880, at age 26, he assumed the leadership of that band, which is known as "The President's Own". He resigned his position in 1892, at the urging of a promoter, and formed his own civilian concert band. The Sousa Band, as well as Sousa's many compositions, gained world-wide fame over the next several decades.

Although during his long musical career Sousa wrote nearly 140 marches, in addition to numerous songs and several operettas, his most famous and often performed piece is *The Stars and Stripes Forev-er*. The inspiration for this stirring march came to Sousa when he and his wife were aboard a ship in 1896, returning from a vacation in Europe. Sousa wrote in his autobiography that he had been on the ship's deck, deep in thought over unexpected circumstances that could affect the future of his band. He recalled, "Here came one of the most vivid incidents of my career. As the vessel steamed out of the harbor I was pacing on the deck, absorbed in thoughts of...the many duties and decisions which awaited me in New York. Suddenly, I began to sense a rhythmic beat of a band playing within my brain. Throughout the whole tense voyage, that imaginary band continued to unfold the same themes, echoing and re-echoing the most distinct melody."

The success of his new composition was immediate, and it was performed by the Sousa Band at almost every concert until Sousa's death in 1932. In 1987, during the Reagan Presidency, *The Stars and Stripes Forever* was officially designated as the National March of the United States.

As we fly the Stars and Stripes on June 14, consider the opening lines of John Philip Sousa's musical tribute to our flag:

Let martial note in triumph float / And liberty extend its mighty hand. A flag appears 'mid thunderous cheers / The banner of the Western land. The emblem of the brave and true / Its folds protect no tyrant crew; The red and white and starry blue / Is freedom's shield and hope...

Hurrah for the flag of the free! May it wave as our standard forever.



# June is National Safety Month




