



#### Celebrating Our Nation's Flag

"Resolved, that the Flag of the thirteen United States shall be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the Union be thirteen stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation."

With this resolution, passed by the Continental Congress on **June 14, 1777**, the basic design of America's flag was set. Although 37 stars have been added to the union since then, the flag still flies as a symbol of our great nation, "the Republic for which it stands", and the freedom it represents.

Stars and e stripes or forever!

Our flag has been celebrated through the years in poetry and song, most notably in our National Anthem, *The Star-Spangled Banner*. In the early 1900s, though, another song, this one written by the "Yankee Doodle boy", George M. Cohan, became a red-white-and-blue American standard. Cohan was already an established performer and songwriter when he wrote *You're a Grand Old Flag* in 1906.

According to Cohan, the inspiration for the lyrics of the song came from a fortuitous encounter he had with a Civil War veteran. The elderly man, who was holding an American flag which was ragged, but obviously folded with great care, turned to Cohan and said with pride, "She's a grand old rag". Recognizing a good line when he heard it, Cohan's original idea was to title his new song, based on the veteran's remark, *You're a Grand Old Rag*, but wisely renamed it after hearing many objections to the nation's flag being described as a "rag". The tune, with revised words, was introduced in his new musical stage show *George Washington*, *Jr*. Marching back and forth across the stage, Cohan carried an American flag while singing his now-famous song, which begins:

You're a grand old flag,
You're a high flying flag
And forever in peace may you wave.
You're the emblem of the land I love,
The home of the free and the brave.

It was the first song from a musical show to sell over a million sheet music copies.

Cohan was an unabashed, patriotic flag-waver throughout much of his life, often incorporating music that provided opportunities for displaying the Stars and Stripes in his shows. In 1932, at age 54, he wrote and performed another song about our National Emblem, this time in a movie. Though now a nearly-forgotten part of motion picture history, the song, characteristic of Cohan's all-American spirit, was titled *Maybe Someone Ought to Wave a Flag*.

It's good advice for all of us, not only on Flag Day, but every day, as we echo a few more of Cohan's lyrics in You're a Grand Old Flag:

Red, white and blue, I am for you! Honest, you're a grand old flag!

Growing up as a military daughter – an "Air Force brat," Sophia E. Johnson saw a lot of the country and world, but spent most of her early childhood and

teen years in Avondale, Arizona. She has made Avondale her home and now wants to serve her neighbors in the State Legislature and make a positive difference in their lives.

For over 11 years in her career, Sophia advanced through the ranks to the level of management assistant for the City of Avondale City Manager's office. For a period of time, she was homeless, but she has also known the finer things in life that she attained through hard work, sometimes working as many as three jobs.

Sophia refuses to allow a chronic health condition to stop her from her regular door-to-door canvassing and campaigning. She has even officially drowned, but was saved by CPR.

Since 2008, she has actively volunteered in politics, doing the basic but important tasks like staffing phone banks and going door-to-door, but using her coordinating talents to help others running for office. She has trained extensively to be a leader in the political sphere, as well as in Total Quality Management, media, and public service.

Now she is eager to listen and learn what the voters in her district want so she can win their support in the 2014 election for State Legislative District 19. To that result, she is going to every home to hear what people say they need in their lives to make things better.

Her energy, sincerity, compassion, intelligence and commitment to the community have been demonstrated repeatedly, as she has served at the New Life Center, a refuge from domestic violence, and currently volunteers at Estrella Care and Rehabilitation Center. Hunger and homelessness, earth day clean ups, reading to students, and youth art programs are all causes for which she has volunteered.

Sophia also volunteers as the Director of Donor Relations for the American Foundation for Cardiomyopathy, which donates automatic external defibrillator systems to schools, Boys and Girls Clubs, and other organizations.

When not volunteering or working, Sophia enjoys reading, swimming and traveling. She is a member of Skyway Church and participates in her local Toastmaster's Club #5909.

Sophia believes everyone should have opportunity, prosperity, health and safety. She is prepared to serve every member of the community to advance all those possibilities.

Ever since she read Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, Sophia feels lead to 'speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves'. Sophia E. Johnson is committed to accomplishing that for Avondale, Tolleson, West Phoenix and Arizona.


