#### **History:**

Constitution in the Classroom started in February, 2012. An AZ Department of Education official brought together a group of five individuals who have a background in Constitutional study. Going forward they began to build an organization for teaching children Constitutional principles. Age appropriate curriculum was developed with Power Point lessons and materials. Thanks to a strong networking system, CitC is now training volunteer teachers on a weekly basis.

#### **Mission Statement:**

Our purpose is to instruct the children of Arizona on the true principles of liberty as established by the framers of the Constitution. This will prepare the next generation to protect and secure these

precious liberties as well as to take an active role in government. Volunteer teachers with age appropriate material will give students a working knowledge of the Constitution and its application to current problems. The goal is to reinforce their determination to protect the basic freedoms of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness which are quickly slipping away.


#### **Lesson Information:**

Meeting Minutes

Americanism - Priscilla offered a quote from James Madison regarding self government and the Ten Commandments.

Introductions - President Debbie Smith recognized the elected officials, officers and guests in attendance.

President's Report - Debbie Smith reminded us of the AzFRW Day at the Legislature on April 2, the April 1st deadline for the Marjorie Miner Scholarship Applications, and the Spring Fling on April 19, where ARW and LD-18 will cosponsor a booth.

Approval of Minutes - Recording Secretary, Terry Giebelhaus asked for approval of the minutes from February 25, 2014. Minutes were approved with no corrections.

Treasurer's Report - Treasurer, Cindy Casaus gave her report, upon which there were no corrections or questions.

Programs - 1st VP of Programs, Suzanne Sharer spoke of plans for April where she is still awaiting confirmations, and May, where Wendy Rogers, Congressional Candidate, and Jeff DeWitt, Candidate for State Treasurer will be our speakers.

Membership - 2nd VP, Mary Baumbach reported on the Candidate Walk, and BBQ this coming Saturday, March 29, at her home. She urged everyone to carry membership pamphlets to hand out to interested women. NFRW Member cards are ready for those who have renewed. Three Convention 2015 pins are available for sale for \$20.

Ways and Means - 3rd VP, Marilyn Astroth offered 50/50 tickets for sale. Two or more drawings will be for books. There are pieces of jewelry, phone charms and more books for sale as well.

Communications - Loraine Pellegrino announced that submissions for the newsletter should be sent to her by the end of the month. Advertising space is offered for sale to business and candidates. The ARW Twitter account has nearly 1000 followers. Please follow ARW on Facebook as well.

Education & Literacy Committee - Rhonda Smith and Carol Wyatt spoke of "Constitution in the Classroom". They explained the program and expressed the need for more teachers, and that they would like to expand into the Ahwatukee schools.

Program - Suzanne Sharer introduced Andrew Thomas, candidate for Governor. He spoke of Education and Immigration and how they are heavily controlled by liberal activists. He asked for clean election donations and took questions from the members. City Councilman Sal DiCiccio spoke on redesigning the way things are done in the city government as well the four pillars he believes can make our city prosperous.

Charles Boles, candidate for Justice of the Peace in the University Lakes Precinct, spoke about his race and asked for support. Darryl Jacobsen-Barnes, candidate for Justice of the Peace, spoke of her qualifications

Jill Norgaard, candidate for the State House of Representatives, gave her opinions on important issues.

Tom Morrissey, candidate for State Senate, talked about empowerment of government officials needing to move to the people. The 50/50 drawing of \$60 was won by Debbie Smith. The book drawings were won by Jim Bie, Carol Wyatt and Margaret Strachan.

The Meeting was adjourned at 8:29 PM by President Debbie Smith.

### A Sound Conservative Principle: Less Is More

Which U.S. President made the following statements and astute observations about taxation and the negative effects of high taxes on the economy and freedom? Hint: yes, he was a Republican .

"A government which requires of the people the contribution of the bulk of their substance and rewards cannot be classed as a free government, or long remain as such."

"I want the people of America to be able to work less for the Government and more for themselves. I want them to have the rewards of their own industry. That is the chief meaning of freedom."



"The method of raising revenue ought not to impede the transaction of business; it ought to encourage it. I am opposed to extremely high rates, because they produce little or no revenue, because they are bad for the country, and, finally, because they are wrong...The wise and correct course to follow in taxation and all other economic legislation is not to destroy those who have already secured success, but to create conditions under which everyone will have a better chance to be successful."

"I am not advocating tax reduction merely for the benefit of the taxpayer; I am advocating it for the benefit of the country."

These were the words of our 30<sup>th</sup> President, Calvin Coolidge, who, incidentally, wrote his own speeches, and meant every word. "Silent Cal" actually had much to say that would be beneficial and instructive for Americans, including Republicans, today. Amity Shlaes, author of the book *Coolidge*, considers him a model of true conservative, and successful, leadership.

Having served as Warren Harding's Vice President, Coolidge was sworn in as Chief Executive following Harding's death in 1923. From then until his presidency ended in 1929, his policies reflected the sound conservative principles and values he had learned growing up on a farm in rural Vermont (when Vermont was still conservative) and working in his father's store. He respected the rule of law and foundation for limited government set forth in the Constitution, believed that government should be the public's servant, and firmly insisted that spending cuts must accompany tax cuts. The result was an era of general prosperity, with job growth and higher wages, a better standard of living, budget surpluses and a reduced federal bureaucracy.

A few closing thoughts from "Silent Cal":

"A government which lays taxes on the people not required by urgent public necessity and sound public policy is not a protector of liberty, but an instrument of tyranny. It condemns the citizen to servitude. One of the first signs of the breaking down of a free government is a disregard by the taxing power of the right of the people to own their own property... Unless the people can enjoy that reasonable security in the possession of their property, which is guaranteed in the Constitution, against unreasonable taxation, freedom is at an end. The common man is restrained and hampered in his ability to secure food and clothing and shelter... Against the recurring tendency in this direction there must be interposed the constant effort of an informed electorate and of patriotic public servants. The importance of a constant reiteration of these principles cannot be overestimated."


