

Meeting Minutes

Introductions - President Debbie Smith recognized the elected officials, AzFRW officers and guests in attendance.

**Approval of Minutes** - President, Debbie Smith asked for approval of the minutes from April 22. Minutes were approved with no corrections.

**Treasury Report** - Cindy Casaus, Treasurer, reported that in April, eight contributions were donated to scholarships by the Ahwatukee Republican Women. There were no objections to the Treasurer's report - it will be filed.

**President's Report** - President, Debbie Smith gave a reminder of the Arizona Federation of Republican Women's Summer Meeting in Tucson at the Radisson Suites on June 27-28 and that registration information is on the website. Deadline for rooms is June 10, and deadline for registration is June 17. The Marjorie Miner Scholarship will be awarded tonight to Jessica Marie Kolodziej. The scholarship committee was given thanks for the hard work.

**Scholarship Presentation** - Cindy Casaus gave an introduction of Marjorie Miner who then officially announced the winner of the 2014 Ahwatukee Republican Women's Marjorie Miner Scholarship. Jessica Marie Kolodziej was in attendance to accept the award, and gave her thanks.

**Program** - Ret. Lt. Col. **Wendy Rogers**, Candidate for US House of Representatives in Congressional District 9, was the first speaker. She spoke of her military background and her qualifications for the office by being a small business owner and military veteran. **Andrew Walter**, also a Candidate for US House of Representatives in District 9 spoke next. He gave his background and reasons for running, and then offered the 7 points he'd take to Washington. Both then accepted questions. Wendy also, because of a last minute conflict, spoke on behalf of **Jeff DeWit**, running for State Treasurer, giving his successful background in investing. Other candidates who spoke were **Viola Klype**, running for TUHS Board, **Jill Norgaard**, running for State Representative in LD-18, **Charles Boles**, running for Tempe Justice of the Peace, **Tom Morrissey**, candidate for State Senate in LD-18, and **Michelle Delgado**, candidate for the Maricopa County Community College District Governing Board.

# **Our Other Motto**

Even though "In God We Trust" was officially declared America's National Motto in 1956, President Obama managed to get it wrong when, in a speech, he identified the motto as "E Pluribus Unum". While it may not be the official U.S. motto, the evidence of this phrase's use as a motto throughout our country's history, even after 1956, prompted the Department of State to attempt to clarify the matter in 1963, by stating, "'In God We Trust' is *the* motto of the



United States. It seems to the Department, nevertheless, that there is ample basis both in history and in law for calling 'E Pluribus Unum' *a* motto of the United States."

"E Pluribus Unum", translated as "out of many, one" or "one from many", was a familiar phrase to the more literate among colonial America's population, who regularly read an influential periodical *The Gentleman's Magazine, or Monthly Intelligencer*, which had been published in London since 1731. The Latin phrase was used on the title page of a special edition, a compilation of articles from previous issues, that was published each year. "E Pluribus Unum" was the magazine's way of describing this annual issue as "one issue from many previous issues". A similar British publication from the late 1600s, *The Gentleman's Journal, or the Monthly Miscellany*, also used the same Latin motto. Variations of the phrase could be found in several literary works dating back to Roman times, as well as in St. Augustine's *Confessions*. It seems likely that the well-educated, well-read Founders who proposed including the motto as part of the design for the Great Seal of the United States after independence was declared, could have come across the Latin phrase in any of these sources, or others, and realized how well it would apply to the new union composed of individual states.

Following the adoption of the final design for the Great Seal in 1782 (the topic for the next Americanism article), "E Pluribus Unum" gained wider recognition and began to appear on state coins. According to U.S. Treasury records, the motto was first used on U.S. coinage in 1795, and its use was soon expanded to include all gold and silver U.S. coins. When a Revised U.S. Mint Code took effect in 1837, though, the motto was dropped as a way of indicating the changes in the standards for the metal content in the coins at that time. By the 1860s, however, several types of coins again displayed the phrase and, in 1873, a law was passed which required "E Pluribus Unum" to appear on all U.S. coins. The Presidential dollars that began to be produced in 2007 include both "E Pluribus Unum" and "In God We Trust".

In addition to our coins, currency and the Great Seal, the motto "E Pluribus Unum" is found on the seals of the President, Vice President, U.S. Congress, and the seal of the Supreme Court. At the U.S. Capitol, the phrase appears on the pedestal of the bronze Statue of Freedom, which crowns the Capitol Dome, as well as inside the Capitol Rotunda, where it is part of the fresco *The Apotheosis of Washington*, painted during the Civil War.

"E Pluribus Unum" has been a part of America's heritage since the nation's founding. It can still rightly be considered *a* motto of the United States, although any U.S. President worthy of the office and our respect should know what the *official* motto of our country now is. Or perhaps it is time to reconsider the motto once suggested by Benjamin Franklin, "Rebellion to Tyrants Is Obedience to God".


